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2 Q Sir, Mr. Paradiso, it's fair to say, was a  
3 suspect in this particular case for approximately  
4 three years at the time that you arrested him?

5 A Since August 14th.

6 Q Approximately three years prior to the time you  
7 arrested him he was a suspect in this case?

8 A That's correct.

9 Q And when you arrested him, he merely said, "I've  
10 been waiting for this for three years, is that  
11 correct ?

12 A He said that, yes.

13 Q Sir, you stated you had twenty to thirty  
14 conversations with Doyle?

15 A Yes.

16 Q During the course of the last three-and-a half  
17 years?

18 A Yes, sir.

19 Q Do you have any notes of any of those  
20 communications?

21 A No, I don't.

22 Q Well, he was a suspect in this case also, wasn't  
23 he?

24 A Not in my mind, no.

1  
2 Q Sir, I'm saying, he was a suspect in this case  
3 also, wasn't he, at one point?

4 A Does it say that somewhere? I don't know. I  
5 believe at some point he was questioned about  
6 any possible involvement, yes.

7 Q Sir, did you ever talk to Mr. Cook about this  
8 case?

9 A Yes.

10 Q You know that he was Mr. Cook's suspect early  
11 on, don't you?

12 A Mr. Cook is torn between two suspects, Mr.  
13 Paradiso and Mr. Doyle.

14 Q Correct. So you were aware of the fact that Mr  
15 Doyle was a suspect in this case as well?

16 A I was aware that he was a possible suspect, and  
17 that's why I interviewed him.

18 Q Okay. You're aware that he was a possible  
19 suspect, correct?

20 A Yes.

21 Q You've spoken to him twenty to thirty times?

22 A Yes, sir.

23 Q Do you remember the sum and substance of each of  
24 those conversations?

1  
2 A No, I don't recall the sum and substance of them.

3 Q You never kept one report of any of those  
4 conversations?

5 A No.

MR. RAPPAPORT: No further  
questions.

REDIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BURKE

Q These conversations that you had with Doyle, were  
they formal interviews, where you tape recorded  
every conversation that you had with him?

A No, they were not. They were conversations where  
he came to me.

Q All right. You say he came to you.

A Yes, sir.

Q And did he volunteer information to you about what  
had happened the night --

A Yes, sir.

Q -- where his whereabouts were?

A Yes, he did. He was very straightforward about  
everything.

Q Now, with regard to the dig-out marks that were  
at the scene, did you examine the weather  
reports from that night, on August 14, 1979?
