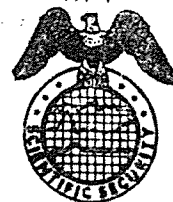

Subject: Report of polygraph examination

To: Mr. John Cavicchi, Esq.

At the request of Mr. John Cavicchi, Esq. representing the legal interests of Mr. Leonard J. Paradiso a polygraph examination was extended to:

Mr. Leonard J. Paradiso

on August 28, 1979, at our offices in Boston, Massachusetts.

Our efforts were requested in an effort to support the truthfulness of Mr. Paradiso's account regarding his contacts with one Marie B. Ianuzzi, deceased. Information, including newspaper accounts, regarding the finding of Ianuzzi's body and determination that she had been a victim of homicide was furnished by Mr. Cavicchi. While the available information did lack detailed facts as to actual cause of death, injuries, etc. an adequate basis for a polygraph examination was present since a specific place was known and it was clear that some injury had been inflicted by person/s unknown. It was further made known that Mr. Paradiso had been questioned by investigators and related having been in the presence of Ianuzzi at the approximate time she was last seen alive. Mr. Paradiso had not been actually charged and/or accused of specific actions related to the death of Ianuzzi which further reduced the clarity in the area of "distinctness of issue".

Evaluation of the available information as opposed to the account of Mr. Paradiso and his outright denials that he had been with Ianuzzi after leaving her outside the Cardinales Club, indicated the viability of a structured examination utilizing the following relevant questions. (answers indicated)

Regarding whether or not you killed Marie Ianuzzi, do you intend to answer all questions about that truthfully?....."Yes"

Did you choke Marie Ianuzzi?....."No"

Did you leave Marie Ianuzzi at Lynn Marshes where she was found?....."No"

Were you with Marie Ianuzzi at Lynn Marshes?....."No"

Did you injure Marie Ianuzzi?....."No"

The polygraph charts were evaluated following which it is the opinion of the undersigned examiner that the detection of deception technique does support the truthfulness of Mr. Paradiso's answers to the above listed relevant questions. No difficulties were encountered during the examination and Mr. Paradiso is considered a fit subject for polygraph testing (on August 28, 1979).
