2 A Yes.

3 Q David, after you identified the body, what's the  
4 next thing you did?

5 A We went upstairs to a room with the inspectors.

6 Q At that time that you were in the room talking

10 Q Did any of the police who were there at the

Marie?

A Going out with her at a time, off and on, from what I understand.

A At the wake.

Q What does Fisher do?

A Excuse me?

Q He comes up to you, and what does he say to you?

A We talked about Marie. And it's the first time I had ever formally met him. And he said, "Why don't me and you go for a drink and talk about things?" He said, "We have a lot in common; we both loved the same girl."

16 himself and having a good time. And I asked him  
17 if he could keep it down a little, and he swore  
18 at me.

19 Q What did you do, David?

20 A I knocked some of the stuff off the bar, and I  
21 picked up the barstool and it turned into a  
22 scuffle.

23 Q Did you get involved in a fight with him, in a  
24 scuffle?

A Yes, I did.

Q Was Eddie Fisher there?

A Yes.

Q And was Tony Leonti there?

A I think he was there, yes.

Q And then some people started asking you about what happened to your hands after that?

A Nobody came up to me and asked me about it.

Q Did you learn that they asked the police, they told the police about some scratches on your hands then?
